

There are lots of different types of allergies, and a lot of people experience allergy symptoms. These can be caused by grasses and pollen, animals, foods (like milk, wheat, or nuts), chemicals (like soaps, sprays, cleaning products), and more. Around one third of people experience allergy symptoms.
