Activity 1: Tents

Learn what all the names are for the different parts of the tent, and label your picture with the right names.

In the episode, Queenie cooks some unusual radish soup, followed by a main course of marshmallows. Afterwards, everyone has hot chocolate in their tents. Imagine what meal you would cook on a campfire, and then write the menu out below. Show the different courses, and what ingredients are in each course.

Activity 3: A Poem To Read
