Activity 1: Falafel Waffles

Think about some of your favorite meals, and then work out which two might go together to make a new combined meal - like falafel waffles, or cereal ice-cream, or sausage cake. Once you've identified your two, write out a recipe below that describes how to make your new meal!

Activity 2: Draw A Cooking Class

In the episode, Queenie invites some of her friends around to the Club for a cooking class with Chef Katie Currant. Two of them make waffles, two make falafel, and Queenie makes falafel waffles. Think about what the Club looks like with everyone in there cooking, and then draw the scene in the box below. I bet it's busy and full of cooking thingies!
